- Single disk drive

- One or two joysticks

Loading Instructions

Atari

- I. Make sure a joystick is plugged into port 1 of the computer.
- 2. Turn on the monitor or TV and the disk drive.
- Insert The Deeper Dungeons disk into the disk drive and close the disk drive door.
- 4. Turn on the computer. The program will load into your computer's memory. Follow the on-screen instructions when prompted to insert your original *Gauntlet* disk.
- 5. When you see the prompt "INSERT DEEPER DUNGEON DISK PRESS START," remove *Gauntlet* from the disk drive and insert *The Deeper Dungeons* disk into the disk drive. Close the disk drive door and press START.
- 6. Next, press the joystick fire button. In a few seconds, you'll find yourself transported to the Deeper Dungeons.

Commodore

- 1. Make sure a joystick is plugged into port 1 of the computer.
- 2. Turn on the monitor or TV, the disk drive, and the computer.
- Insert The Deeper Dungeons disk into the disk drive and close the disk drive door.
- 4. Type LOAD"*", 8,1 and press RETURN.
- 5. In a few seconds, an on-screen prompt will appear. Follow the on-screen instructions to remove *The Deeper Dungeons* disk from the disk drive and insert your original *Gauntlet* disk into the disk drive. Close the disk drive door, and then press the joystick fire button.
- 6. In a few more seconds, another on-screen prompt will appear. Follow the on-screen instructions to remove the *Gauntlet* disk from the disk drive and insert *The Deeper Dungeons* disk into the disk drive. Close the disk drive door, and then press the joystick fire button. You'll find yourself transported to the Deeper Dungeons.
