Bumble Plot is a set of five educational games introducing positive and negative numbers, number pairs, grids, and computer graphics. This learning builds basic knowledge and skills for the computer age.

The educational games are arranged according to difficulty, so learning occurs naturally. Some activities develop analytical thinking and logical reasoning. Others encourage imagination and creativity. In all the activities children are learning intellectual skills and applying them in practical, stimulating ways.

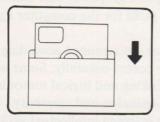
The Bumble Plot games feature color graphics and music. Play the games and learn math concepts in a new way.



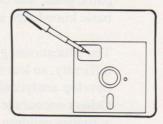
CARING FOR YOUR BUMBLE PLOT DISKETTE

To keep your Bumble Plot diskette in good operating condition, observe the following precautions:

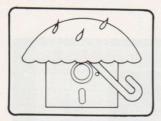
Do's



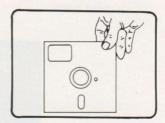
Store the diskette in its protective jacket after use.



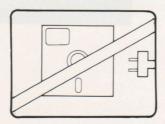
Use a felt tip pen only when writing on the label to avoid damaging the diskette.



Keep the diskette dry.

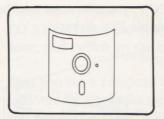


Grasp by a corner.

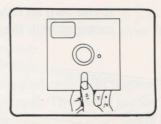


Keep it away from electrical equipment (including the telephone and the TV).

Don'ts

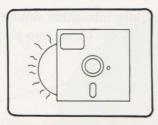


Don't bend.

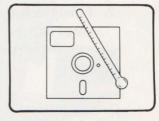


Don't touch the diskette through openings in the envelope. This could damage the exposed magnetic surface of the diskette

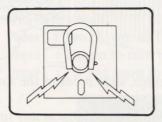
Diskettes are sensitive to temperature extremes.



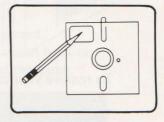
Keep your diskette out of direct sunlight.



Don't get it too hot nor too cold.



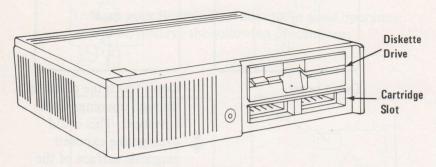
Don't place a diskette near magnets...



nor use clips, pencils, or ballpoint pens.

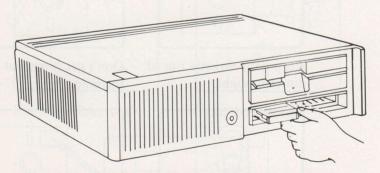
Playing Bumble Plot on the IBM PC jr

If you own an IBM PCjr, you also must use the Basic cartridge with the Bumble Plot diskette.



To insert your cartridge:

- 1. Hold your cartridge with the label up so you can read it.
- 2. Firmly slide the cartridge into either slot until it snaps into place. If it doesn't snap into place, make sure the label side is up.



To remove your cartridge, slide it out of the slot.

You may insert or remove a cartridge at any time while the power is on. When you insert or remove a cartridge, your IBM PC*jr* behaves as if you just switched the power on.

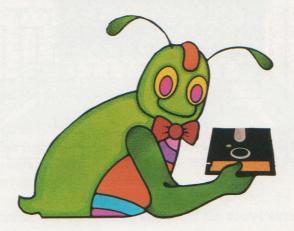
GETTING STARTED

TO START: Put the diskette in the disk drive, close the door, and switch on the computer.

First you see a company name and copyright page followed by a colorful title picture. The list of games you see next is called a *menu*.

The games are numbered l to 5. To choose a game, type a number.

Before you do this, try number 6 on the menu.



The white box around the **ON** tells you the games will have sound.

Press 6 to change to "no sound."

Press 6 again to turn the sound back on.

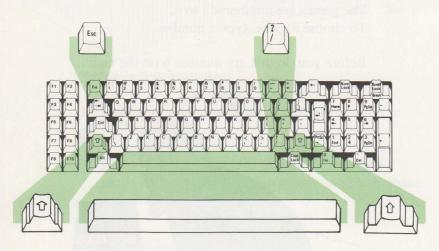
Press 7 if you want to end the game.

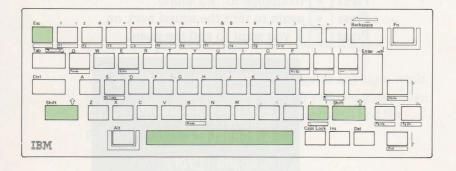

When playing a game you can:

- Look at the directions anytime by holding down the Shift key ① and pressing ?.
- Return to the menu to choose another game by pressing (Esc).

Also you can press the Spacebar to skip the opening pictures and move immediately to the game.

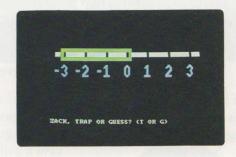




1 TRAP AND GUESS

Bumble is thinking of a secret number. It can be -3,-2,-1,0,1,2, or 3.

Numbers with minus signs (-) are called *negative numbers*. You use them to count backwards past zero (0). For example -3,-2,-1,0,1,2, or 3.



Trap and guess Bumble's secret number.

To trap Bumble's number, type two numbers which you think include the secret number.

To make a negative number use the minus (-) key, on the top row of the keyboard.

Bumble will draw a trap and tell if the secret number is inside or outside the trap.

If it is inside the trap you have two choices. You can type two new numbers to make the trap smaller, or you can try to guess the secret number.

The program will ask which you want to do: TRAP OR GUESS? Type T if you want to trap, and type G to guess.

If the secret number is outside the trap, type two numbers to make a new trap.

Play alone or with a friend.

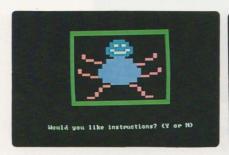
If two people play, Bumble will have a different secret number for each of you.

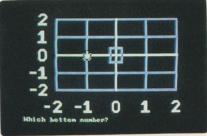




2 BUMBLEBUG

Trap the bumblebug sitting on the grid!





How? Set traps alongside the bumblebug until it hops into the trap. At the beginning of the new game the bumblebug is sitting somewhere on the crossing lines—called a *grid*.

To set a trap, choose a point next to the bumblebug and name the point.

Type the bottom number first and press Enter .
Then type the side number and press Enter .
You will see the square trap at the point you named.

Bumblebug hops! Did you catch it?

You did if the bumblebug hopped into your trap.

If you didn't, set a new trap.

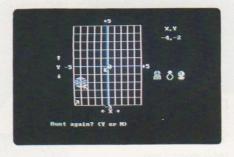
3 HIDDEN TREASURE



Bumble's underwater map shows arrows as clues.

Bumble's map goes from -5 (negative five) to +5 (positive five) in two directions.

- The left to right (horizontal) direction is the X direction, or X axis.
- The up and down (vertical) direction is the Y direction, or Y axis.



Name the point you guess by giving its distance in each direction.

Type the X number; next type a comma [,]; then type the Y number and press Enter .

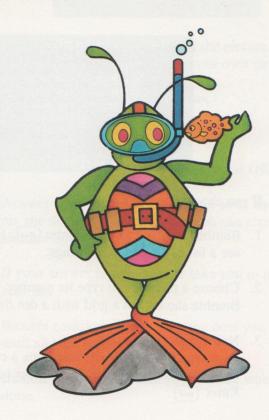
The X and Y numbers are called coordinates.

Watch the moving dot land. Read the arrow and word clues and keep hunting!

Find all the treasure!

There are 16 treasures altogether. Something special happens when you find six of them.

4 BUMBLE ART

You may choose to:

- 1. Make Bumble's pictures. Bumble will help you draw a picture.
- 2. Make your own drawing. You can make a picture for a friend.

1. STAR	(6 DOTS)
2. MUSHROOM	(10 DOTS)
3. TULIP	(13 DOTS)
4. BEAGLE	(17 DOTS)
5. HAPPY	(17 DOTS)
6. AUTO	(18 DOTS)
7. BUMBLE	(18 DOTS)

If you choose Bumble's pictures:

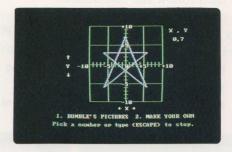
- 1. Bumble asks you to press Enter ; then you will see a list of Bumble's drawings.
- 2. Choose a picture and type its number. Bumble shows you a grid with a dot on it.
- 3. Name that dot.

 First type the X number; then type a comma [,];
 next type the Y number. Remember to press

 Enter .
- 4. Keep naming the dots Bumble shows you.

 Bumble draws a line connecting each one. If you make a mistake, Bumble will tell you how to correct it.

Watch the picture grow!



Press [Esc] during the game to end the picture, to choose a new picture, or to make your own picture.

If you want to make your own picture:

- 1. Bumble asks you to name your first dot.
- 2. Bumble shows your dot and asks if it is OK.

Answer Y for yes and N for no. If your answer is no, the dot will disappear, and you can choose another dot.

If your answer is yes, Bumble asks you to name the next dot.

- 3. Bumble continues connecting the dots you name, until all your dots are on the grid.
- 4. Bumble asks you to name your picture when it is done.
- 5. Bumble asks if your friend wants to make your picture.

If your answer is yes, then follow the instructions on the screen.

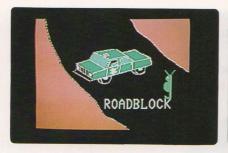
If your answer is no, then Bumble shows your picture and plays a tune.

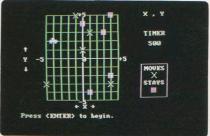


5 ROADBLOCK

THE SCENE: The bank robber in the moving car is escaping from the police and will get away by reaching any of the edges.

Close him in on all sides!





The police (that's you) move roadblocks (X's) to surround the thief and win a badge.

You have five road blocks. You also have five dead-end streets which can be used to help trap the robber.

You can't move the deadends, but they can help block him off.

Playing the game.

- 1. To freeze time press the Spacebar. Then make your move.
- 2. Pick up a roadblock by naming the point where it is. First type the X number. Next type a [,], then type the Y number.
- 3. Put down the roadblock by naming the **X,Y** numbers where you want it to go.

What directions can the robber move? It will help your chase to figure this out.

Remember:

The moment the roadblock is in position, the robber will start moving again. Press the Spacebar to stop the clock. Then put another roadblock in place.

Don't forget, you are working against the clock. You can run out of time as well as lose the robber over the edge.

The clicking numbers tell you how much time remains.

What happens when you trap the robber?

The faster you trap the robber, the further you move up the ranks in the police department: to sergeant, lieutenant, captain, and chief.

Trap the robber a second and third time to see how well you can do.
