# System Components

- Atari MEGA or ST computer
- Atari disk drive
- Atari monitor (color recommended)
- One or two joysticks (optional)

## **Getting Started**

Before you play the game, make a copy of the Robotron: 2084 program disk (see your Atari computer **Owner's Manual** for instructions). Store the original disk for safekeeping. Then follow these steps:

- Turn on your computer system and display GEM® Desktop™. Then insert the copy of the Robotron: 2084 disk into the disk drive.
- Select the floppy disk icon to display the Robotron: 2084 disk directory.
- Select ROBOTRON.PRG. The Robotron: 2084 title and options screen appears.
- Press the function keys to select game options (an option is chosen when it appears on screen):

#### Key Option

- [F2] Use mouse or joystick.
- [F3] One-player or twoplayer game.
- [F4] Use one or two joysticks (not active if you're using a mouse).

- 5. Connect the mouse by plugging it into mouse/joystick port 0. Or connect a joystick by plugging it into joystick port 1. To use two joysticks, unplug the mouse and plug the second joystick into mouse/ joystick port 0. (Two players can use the same mouse, the same joystick, or two joysticks.) With two joysticks, the port 1 joystick moves your player on screen in the direction you move the handle. The port 0 joystick fires in the direction you move its handle.
- Press [F1] to start the game. (Or press the joystick fire button or the left mouse button.)
- During play, press [Space Bar] to pause the game. Press it again to resume play.

# Playing the Game

The Robotrons know about you—and stalk you relentlessly. Your only defenses against them are your wits and your anti-robot laser gun. Maneuver around the screen by rolling the mouse or moving the joystick handle. Fire by pressing your left mouse button or joystick fire button. In a two-joystick game, maneuver by moving the port 1 joystick handle; fire in any direction by moving the port 0 joystick handle.

You begin the game with three lives. As Robotrons chase you, defend yourself by firing on them. A direct hit vaporizes any Robotron except the Indestructible Hulk and earns you points. Bumping into a Robotron costs you a life. For every 25,000 points you score you earn another life and another chance to complete your mission.

The Robotrons attack in waves. Each wave has more Robotrons and is more difficult than the one before. In each wave, Humans wander around in a state of shock. Shoot your way towards the Humans (they won't be hurt by your laser fire) and touch as many as you can to save them.

When you lose a life, you continue the wave with your next life. A wave ends when you destroy all Grunts, Enforcers, Tanks, Brains, Spheroids, and Quarks in the wave. As long as you have lives left, a new wave begins.

The game ends when you lose all your lives. Press the mouse button, joystick fire button, or **[F1]** to begin a new game.

During a game, press [F1] to return to the options screen. Press [Control] [C] or [Undo] at any time to return to the desktop. (To save your high score, make sure your Robotron: 2084 disk is in the drive and is not write-protected.)

### Strategy

At the start of a wave, quickly get away from the middle of the screen. Keep moving to avoid getting yourself trapped in corners.

Concentrate on wiping out the Spheroids and Cubic Quarks first. Then eliminate most of the remaining Robotrons, leaving a few Mindless Grunts alive. Save the Humans before vaporizing the last Robotrons in the wave.

#### Robotrons



Mindless Grunts are beastly robots with one mission—to do you in.



Indestructible Hulks annihilate Humans. They cannot be vaporized— shooting them with your laser gun only slows them down.



Sinister Spheroids hatch evil Enforcers. Enforcers heighten the attack by launching Enforcer Sparks.



Galvanizing Electrodes block your path, changing form with each new wave. Vaporize them fast or they'll destroy youl



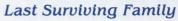
Cubic Quarks swiftly produce beastly Torturing Tanks that throw off Bounce Bombs.







Glant Brains can electrocute you with deadly Cruise Missiles. If a Giant Brain catches a Human, it reprograms the victim who then turns against you viciously as a mutant Prog. Giant Brains are launched every fifth wave.





Only a handful of **Humans** (Men, Women, and Children), cloned from the last Human family, remain alive on Earth.
