Getting Started

For your convenience, World Tour Golf is not copy protected so that you can easily make one backup copy for your own use, or install the program on your hard disk. Please show us that copy protection is unnecessary—do not give copies of this product away. Thank you. Use the following procedure to make a working backup of your World Tour Golf master disk:

1. Insert the World Tour Golf game disk in drive A:.

- 2. If you have two disk drives, insert a blank, formatted disk in drive B:. If you're using one disk drive, be sure you have a blank, formatted disk ready, then skip to next step.
- 3. Type the command, COPY A:*.* B: (Enter).

This command sequence works on single drive systems; however, single drive users should note that when the computer prompts for a disk swap, it refers to the original disk as the "Drive A: disk" and the copy as the "Drive B: disk."

NOTE: You cannot log onto a different drive and load the game in the same command. For example, A: GOLF (Enter) will not work. You must use two separate commands: A: (Enter) then GOLF (Enter).

Hard Disk Installation: Use the following procedure to install World Tour Golf on a hard disk.

- 1. Create a directory for World Tour Golf (e.g., MKDIR \WTG).
- 2. Change to that directory (e.g., CD \WTG).
- 3. Insert the World Tour Golf game disk in drive A:.
- 4. Type A:INSTALL (Enter) to run the hard disk installation program.
- 5. Follow the onscreen instructions for loading the game.

Starting World Tour Golf: Make sure the NUMLOCK key is off, or the keypad arrow keys won't function correctly. If you own a Tandy 1000 with 256K of RAM, you must boot it with DOS 2.11.

- 1. Boot your computer with an MS-DOS disk.
- 2. Remove the DOS disk and insert the World Tour Golf game disk in drive A:.
- 3. Type GOLF to start the game.

Note to original Tandy 1000 owners: You must have a memory expansion board with a DMA chip installed to play World Tour Golf. If you are uncertain about which board is installed on your computer, try to run the game. If the title screen doesn't appear, contact your Tandy dealer to purchase and install a DMA memory board, or return your copy of World Tour Golf to the place of purchase for a refund or exchange.

Graphics Display and Memory

World Tour Golf is mostly self- configuring, but some unusual graphics boards may require the use of one of the following commands:

Note: 4 color selectable is a four color mode in which you can adjust three of the the default colors (black, green, lt. blue, brown). Adjust green, lt. blue and brown by simultaneously pressing the Alt key and 1, 2, or 3 respectively.

A Tandy 1000 with 256K or less available does not have enough memory to run World Tour Golf in 16 colors. World Tour Golf automatically uses 4 color selectable mode on Tandy 1000s with limited memory.

For a system with a monochrome board and a color board, activate the proper board with the DOS MODE command. See your DOS user's manual. For a Compaq portable with an external color monitor, type Ctrl/Alt/< keys simultaneously at the DOS prompt to activate the color display.

Game Play Keyboard Commands

Play World Tour Golf with either a joystick or the keyboard. If you use the keyboard, the diagram to the right shows which keys control a particular direction. These keys are all on the numeric keypad on some computers, but are located in different areas on the keyboard on other computers.

NOTE: Tandy computers have a HOLD key immediately above the Return key that is very easy to press accidentally. The HOLD key pauses the system and makes it appear as if the currently running software is frozen. Press HOLD a second time to resume normal operation.

The Enter, Ins, and + (Plus) keys are equivalent to joystick Button 1. The Spacebar is equivalent to joystick Button 2. Press Esc to return to the previous screen. Press Shift-PrtSc (press Shift and PrtSc keys simultaneously) to print a copy of your scorecard when the scorecard is on the screen. Note: World Tour Golf works with many printers and interface cards without difficulty. However, if you experience strange printing results, you may need to adjust the switch settings on your printer and/or interface card. Consult your printer and interface card owner's manual for the switch adjustments that will correct the problem. Other keys you can use during game play are described below:

‡	Moves the highlight bar up and down in menus, and selects a specific club before each stroke		
\leftrightarrow	Moves between columns in menus, and adjusts your aim while playing a hole.		
Ø or T	Allows you to tap the ball 4 feet. (Only while putting.)		
1	Allows you to hit or putt at 20% relative strength.		
2	Allows you to hit or putt at 40% relative strength.		
3	Allows you to hit or putt at 60% relative strength.		
4	Allows you to hit or putt at 80% relative strength.		
5	Allows you to hit or putt at 100% relative strength.		
G	Sinks a short putt.		
S	Shows your scorecard if a human player is "in play." Any key exits.		
Ctrl-K	Joystick control is bypassed.		
Ctrl-J	Resets joystick for use. Center joystick before using this command.		
Ctrl-V	Toggles sound on/off.		

NOTE TO AT USERS: World Tour Golf does not support the AT joystick.

Construction Set Keyboard Commands

The World Tour Golf construction set contains its own set of keyboard commands that help speed your golf course design. Shortcuts while in "Draw Terrain" include:

Function Key	Key	Function	
F2	F	Fills an enclosed area with the selected terrain. This option does not work with "draw lock" on.	
F5	G	Changes the selected terrain to grass.	
F6	W	Changes the selected terrain to water.	
F7	R	Changes the selected terrain to rough.	
F8	U	Undoes last command. You can Undo an Undo to restore the last command.	
F9	P	Lets you preview the hole. This option toggles on and off.	
F10	D	Toggles "draw lock" on/off. Draw lock lets you drop a continuous series of tiles to outline terrain features.	

Ctrl- ←	Scroll terrain left.
Ctrl- →	Scroll terrain right.
Ctrl-PgUp	Scroll terrain up.
Ctrl-PgDn	Scroll terrain down.

In addition to drawing shortcuts, there are also several shortcuts while in "Finish Hole" mode.

Function Key	Key	Function
F1	T	Distance from arrow to tee.
F2	G	Distance from arrow to green.
F3	D	Draws an arc representing the Driver's maximum range from the tee.
F4	Y	Draws an arc 150 yards from the green to help place yardage markers.
F5	F	Flips object.
F6	L	Places a duplicate of the last object selected on the hole.
F7 & F8	7 and 8	Rotates through the different types of objects.
F9 & F10	9 and 0	Rotates through objects of the current type
N/A	Del	Deletes an object.

Note: These commands function only while working on the left (hole) half of the screen, with the exception of Undo (U) and Flip (F). Also note that the Break command is disabled in World Tour Golf, and Ctrl-C functions the same as the Esc key.

When designing fairway with doglegs (bends), place a par marker at the center of the dogleg to get a more accurate yardage reading (par value). Place a par marker by selecing Object #11 from the Other category under Place Objects. If you change disks to load or save a new course on a single drive system, you may be asked to load an overlay. To prevent this, make a floppy backup and delete one of the two graphics data files to create room on the disk. Tandy 1000s with a minimum of 384K use BM16.DAT. All other modes use BM4.DAT. Save the courses you create on this backup game disk.

Saving Player Characteristics and Quitting the Game

Player characteristics can be saved between games only if you run World Tour Golf on a hard disk, or floppy disk copy with no write-protect tab. Return to original characteristics by deleting the file PLAYERS.DAT (see your DOS user's manual for information on deleting files). The file will be recreated the next time you start the program.

To end the game, repeatedly press Esc until you reach the title screen. Once at the title screen, press Q to quit the program and return to DOS.
