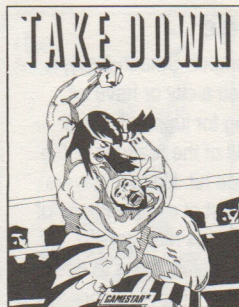


Motocross

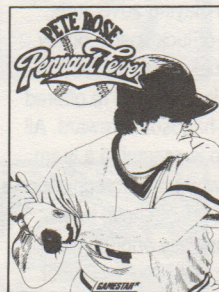


New FaceOff!
